3.1 Installation

```
pip install keras-datasets
```

```
## First clone the repository
git clone https://github.com/DEKHTIARJonathan/keras-datasets.git

## Create a virtualenv
virtualenv venv

# Linux: activate the virtualenv
source venv/bin/activate

# Windows activate the virtualenv
venv\Scripts\activate.bat

## Then install the library
```

```
pip install -r requirements.txt

## Then install the library
python setup.py install
```
