2.1 Installation

2.1.1 Get the code

You can install the package from PyPI:

```
pip install django-briefcase
```

or:

```
easy_install django-briefcase
```

Any packages that django-briefcase depends on, will be automatically downloaded (currently this is Django and South).

Stable releases are located at PyPI. The development version can be installed from Github:

```
git clone git://github.com/zsiciarz/django-briefcase.git
cd django-briefcase
python setup.py install
```

or if you're using pip:

```
\verb|pip install -e git+git://github.com/zsiciarz/django-briefcase.git\#egg=django-briefcase||
```

2.1.2 Configure your project

Add briefcase to your INSTALLED_APPS in settings.py. Then, run python manage.py migrate briefcase to create document-related database tables.

Note: If you don't use South, run python manage.py syncdb, however using South to handle your database schema history is recommended.

2.2 Usage

Right after Installation you can manage your documents from the Django admin site. To actually present them in the front-end, hook the application views into your URLconf.

Example:

```
urlpatterns = patterns('briefcase.views',
    #...
    url(r'^recent_documents/',
        'general.recent_documents',
        name='recent_documents'
),
    url(r'^my_documents/',
        'per_user.my_documents',
        name='my_documents'
),
    url(r'^download/(?P<document_id>\d+)/$',
        'general.download_document',
        name='download_document'
),
    #...
)
```

2.3 Document-related views reference

This is a detailed reference of view functions provided by django-briefcase.

2.3.1 briefcase.views.document_list

A very thin wrapper for the generic object_list view.

Currently we supply here only the template_object_name argument, but more functionality may come and it is good to keep the generic document list in one place. This also allows for a greater customization by setting some view arguments in the URLconf.

Template receives a document_list context variable which is a QuerySet instance.

2.3.2 briefcase.views.general.recent_documents

Renders a list of all documents sorted by creation date.

2.3.3 briefcase.views.general.download_document

Sends the document to the browser.

2.3.4 briefcase.views.per_user.my_documents

Renders a list of all documents added by current user.

2.3.5 briefcase.views.per_user.documents_for_user

Renders a list of documents added by a specific user.

The user can be identified by his username or user_id. If both are specified, username takes precedence.
