Installation

1. Install using pip:

```
pip install django-fa
```

Alternatively, you can install download or clone this repo and call `pip install -e ..`

2. Add to `INSTALLED_APPS` in your `settings.py`:

```
'fa',
```

3. Use the *font-awesome* tag library in your templates

Example template

```
{% load font_awesome %}

{# Load CSS #}

{% fa_css %}

{# Display an icon #}

{% fa 'fa-shield' %}
```
